A local law REGULATING THE OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND PARKING

Section 1. Every provision of any Local Law, Ordinance, Rule or Regulation hereto enacted by the Village of Margaretville, which shall in any manner conflict with this Local Law, is hereby revoked, cancelled and rescinded.

Section 2. The words and phrases used in this Local Law shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them as defined by the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, except that the following term shall be deemed to mean:

A. "Curb" shall include the boundaries of the street or roadway whether marked by curbstone or not so marked.

Section 3. This section shall apply to public streets, Village parking fields and lots and to all non-residential sites which provide off- street parking spaces for 8 or more motor vehicles as defined herein. This section is intended to provide access to non-residential structures by handicapped persons who have appropriately designated vehicles as provided for by law or regulation

No motor vehicles as defined by the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law shall be left parked or standing, and no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle in any place designated as restricted to handicapped

parking unless the vehicle bears a permit issued under VLT#1203a or a registration issued under VLT#404-a of said law and such vehicle is being used at that time for the transportation of a disabled or handicapped person upon or along any of streets, highways or village or privately maintained parking lots with public access in the said Village of Margaretville:

- A. At the corner of Bridge Street and Main Street on the South westerly side of such intersection as such area is striped, marked, posted and maintained in accordance with standards established by the State of New York;
- B. Upon or within the parking places located in the Binnekill parking lot, the Walnut Street parking lot and the fire hall parking lot as such area is striped, marked and posted and maintained in accordance with standards established by the State of New York;
- C. On the southerly side of Main Street as such area is striped, marked and posted and maintained in accordance with standards established by the State of New York;
- D. On the northerly side of Main Street between the Catskill Mt Christian Center and the intersection of Academy Street as such area is striped, marked and posted and maintained in accordance with standards established by the State of New York.
- E. Handicapped parking on non- residential sites. Non-residential sites shall include any building or contiguous buildings used for one or more retail shops for personal service, restaurants, lodges, clubhouses, meeting halls or other places of business or public assembly which provide off-street parking for at least 8 vehicles. Each owner and operator of a non-residential site shall designate a minimum of five percent (5%) of its off-street parking spaces (up to a maximum of 4 spaces) for handicapped parking. The handicapped parking spaces shall be striped, marked and posted and maintained in accordance with standards established by the State of New York, at the sole expense of the owner of such non-residential site.

Section 4. No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended on either side of Bridge Street at any time.

Section 5. No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended on the North side of Main Street between the intersection of Main Street and the entrance of the Margaretville Central School driveway on the West and running approximately 426 feet westerly to the property line of the United States Post Office.

Section 6. No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended for more than thirty minutes while school is in session on the

North Side of Main Street in the Village of Margaretville, New York from the entrance of the Margaretville Central School on the east and westerly approximately 336 feet to the exit of the Margaretville Central School on the west .

- Section 7.** No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended, of the South Side of Main Street in the Village of Margaretville, New York, between the entrance of the Margaretville Central School on the east and the Alfred Nelson Bridge on the west, between the hours of 7:30 AM to 4:30 PM Monday through Friday while school is in session.
- Section 8.** No vehicle of any kind, shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended, on the South Side of Main Street in the Village of Margaretville, New York, between the easterly entrance of the Margaretville Central School on the west and the intersection of Main Street and Academy Street on the east between the hours of 7-9 AM and 2:30-4:00PM Monday through Friday, while school is in session.
- Section 9.** No vehicle of any kind shall be parked, stored or left standing unattended by a person capable of operating it on any street or highway at any time between the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 7:00 A.M. during the period from the first day of November to the first day of April. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to the parking of an ambulance or to a vehicle operated by a physician or surgeon on a professional call.
- Section 10.** No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended within ten (10) feet of a fire hydrant or within twenty five (25) feet of the corner of the intersection of Bridge Street and Main Street, or within twenty five (25) feet of the corner of the intersection of Walnut Street and Main Street in the Village of Margaretville.
- Section 11.** No vehicle of any kind shall be parked or left standing, attended or unattended, where the curb is painted with yellow paint.
- Section 12.** No person shall drive or operate, or cause to be driven or operated, on any street or public highway within the Village of Margaretville any motor vehicle, motor cycle or motor propelled vehicle, at a rate of speed in excess of thirty miles per hour.
- Section 13.** Stop Intersections. shall be as follows:

- A. The intersections described herein are hereby designated as stop intersections, and stop signs shall be erected as indicated.
- B. Except when directed to proceed by a police officer, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop sign shall stop at the stop line but if none, stop before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or in the event that there is no crosswalk, at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection.
- C. Stop Intersection within the Village are:
  - 1. Church Street intersecting with Maple Street 2 locations,
  - 2. Maple Street intersecting with Main Street,
  - 3. Orchard Street intersecting with Walnut Street 2 locations,
  - 4. Swart Street intersecting with Walnut Street,
  - 5. Walnut Street intersecting with Main Street,
  - 6. Bull Run Road intersecting with Margaretville Mountain Road,
  - 7. Academy Street intersecting with Main Street,
  - 8. Mountain Avenue intersecting with Swart Street and Orchard Street,
  - 9. Fair Street intersecting with Main Street and State Route 28/30,
  - 10. South Spur Road intersecting with Fair Street,
  - 11. Cemetery Road intersecting with Main Street,
  - 12. Bridge Street intersecting with State Route 28,
  - 13. Swart Street intersecting with Academy Street,
  - 14. Academy Street Extension intersecting with Academy Street .

**Section 14.** Every person or persons operating, driving or causing to be operated or driven any motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, wagon or other mode of conveyance in and upon the public streets and highways of the Village of Margaretville, and every and all persons going upon, traversing, walking upon, crossing, occupying or using any portion or the whole of the public streets, highways and sidewalks in said Village of Margaretville, shall be controlled by, observe, comply with and obey all traffic rules and regulations, directions of Peace Officers with regards thereto, traffic signals, signs or signals, traffic markers or lines, traffic signal lights or other visual indications of control of vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

**Section 15.** Any vehicle found to be in violation of any Section of this Local Law, may, in the discretion of any Peace or Police Officer or the Street or Water Superintendents or their deputies, be towed away to a suitable location. All costs and expenses for said towing and storage charges, if any, shall be paid for by the owner of the vehicle, separate and apart from any other penalty hereunder. Neither the Village of Margaretville, it's agents or employees shall be liable for any damage to or suffered by the

vehicle during towing or storage.

**Section 16.** Consistant with the provisions of this local law, signage shall be erected and maintained by the Village of Margaretville.

**Section 17.** The invalidity of any clause, sentence, paragraph or provisions of the Local Law shall not invalidate any other clause, sentence, paragraph of part hereof.

**Section 18.** A violation of this Local Law or any provisions or parts thereof, by any person, firm or corporation, is hereby declared to be an offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding two-hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars, Each day's continued violation shall consititute a separate and additional offense. For the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers general violations of this Local Law or provisions or parts thereof, shall be deemed a violation as defined by Section 10.00 (3) of the Penal Law of the State of New York.

**Section 19.** This local law will take effect immediately upon the filing with the Secretary of State.
